### HARD CASE OF REJECTED FAMILY

Reach Winnipeg at Expense of  
\$2.25; Then Deported on Doc-  
tor's Report

(Times Special Correspondence)

London, Oct. 11.—The Local Government  
Board is to consider the case of a family  
who were sent to Canada by the Darling-  
ton Guardians and who were deported on  
account of one of the children suffering  
from tuberculosis. Doctor Wormald,  
medical adviser to the guardians, said he  
understood the child was passed by the  
doctor in Montreal, but in Winnipeg the  
doctor said she had phthisis.

Doctor Wormald, who has examined the  
girl says he can find no signs of the dis-  
ease. Arthur Hawkes will be remem-  
bered as the man who was the medical  
examiner on behalf of the Canadian  
government should be made on this side  
so as to avoid people being deported. The  
present case seems to establish some ex-  
port for that opinion. These people got  
as far as Winnipeg at a cost of about \$225  
before it was decided to deport them.
