



It is estimated that the pelts taken will reach two million dollars in value. The feature of the season was the percord number of fishers or black cats trapped. The fishers are now the prizes of the Adirondack forests, their skins bringing the highest price of any mountain fur bearers. Extra fine fisher pelts this season netted trappers as much as \$125 each. 




