Cure for the Distemper in Cattle.—The symptoms of the disease are, the animal wishes to stand away from the rest of the cattle, with its fore legs apart and its head hung down. The sides heave violently, and sometimes tremble as if from cold, the tail stuck close to its quarters, the top of the horns very cold, and the mouth blistered, with a total disinclination to food. The following doses will be found most effectual, if given as soon as the symptoms are discovered:—One pound of Epson Salts, one ounce of nitre, and one ounce of ground ginger, dissolve in about three pints of lukewarm water, and given from a bottle—in about thirty or thirty-six hours afterwards; the second dose to be given, consists of one pound of Epson salts, half an ounce of nitre, half an ounce of
