TORONTO EYE AND EAR INFIRMARY.

This Institution, situated No. 21 Adelaide St.
 West, was established for the relief of poor per-
 sons suffering from diseases of the eye and ear,
 irrespective of color, country, or creed.

Two surgeons are in attendance every morn-
 ing (Sundays excepted), at half-past nine a.m.

A limited number can be admitted as *in-door*
 patients under the following conditions:

1st. They must conform to prescribed rules,
 and every violation of these will render the
 offender liable to dismissal.

2d. All travelling expenses to and from Tor-
 onto must be paid either by the patients or those
 sending them.

3d. Three dollars per week must be paid for
 each patient towards expenses of board, washing
 and lodging. Medicines and medical treatment
free.

4th. Five weeks board must be paid in ad-
 vance; a proportionate sum will be returned to
 the patient, who may leave before the expiration
 of the time.

Emigrants, strangers, vagrants and waifs may
 be admitted free of all charges at the discretion
 of the Senior Surgeon.

This Institution is supported partly by a grant
 from the Provincial Government, a smaller one
 from the city of Toronto, and the rest by volun-
 tary subscriptions.
