

A RUSSIAN LETTER.

(New York Times.) A significant light is thrown upon the state of unrest prevailing all classes in Russia by the personal message of a prominent Russian to a friend in this country which we are permitted to publish.

He is related to members of the military and is himself a high official. His message was written in French in one of the Red Cross picture postal cards which have been sold in large numbers to swell the fund to care for the victims of Japanese bullets.

I had wished to write this letter, above all, about our ideas on the war. The war is most unpopular, and we all desire our own defeat.

WIFE MURDERER HANGED IN JAIL.

Dies Eighteen Minutes After Trap Was Sprung.

He Left a Confession that He Alone Was Responsible for the Deed.

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va., Feb. 10.—J. Samuel McCue, former mayor of this city, was hanged in the county jail here at 7:34 o'clock this morning for the murder of his wife on Friday Sept. 4th, 1904.

Immediately after the execution McCue's three spiritual advisers gave out the following signed statement: J. Samuel McCue stated this morning in our presence, and requested us to make public, that he did not wish to leave this world with suspicion resting on any human being other than himself.

RUSSIAN STRIKES. Iron Works at St. Petersburg Closed—12,000 Men Quit One Factory.

ST. PETERSBURG, Feb. 10.—The Putiloff Iron Works and the Franco-Russian works are again closed, the men having walked out in a body at 10 o'clock this morning in consequence of the refusal of their employers to grant an eight hour day.

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld., Feb. 10.—The crew of the British brig Vidonia, which was caught in the ice floe and blizzard night, were found wandering in the snow and were badly frost bitten.

WARSZAWA, Feb. 10.—Over a hundred strikers were killed or wounded by the military at the conflict which took place at the Katherine Iron Works at Pomicovitch yesterday evening.

CHICAGO, Feb. 10.—Johann Hoch, after being "sweated" for hours by the police early this morning, confessed that he had been married to ten women.

VERMONT DRY. BURLINGTON, Vt., Feb. 10.—Reports received here last night from all sections of Vermont indicate that the most widespread drought in the history of the state is being experienced.

HE IS NOT DEAD. WARSZAWA, Feb. 10.—The report of the death of Governor-General Tchertkoff (published by the London papers this morning) is unfounded.

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PRISONERS YELLED. NEW YORK, Feb. 10.—Thirty-five cars valued at \$150,000 were destroyed by fire in the storage barns of the New York City Railway Company.

DULUTH, Minn., Feb. 10.—Another cold wave has settled over the head of the lakes, the thermometer today registering 29 degrees below zero, a fall of 25 degrees in eighteen hours.

BUFFALO, N. Y., Feb. 10.—Frank Cotech, champion of America, defeated Alexander Samuelsen, the Swedish wrestler in a catch-as-catch-can match last night, taking two straight falls in 24:15 and 12:40 respectively.

COURT CONDEMNED STEAMER

Caught Running the Vladivostok Blockade—

What the Japanese Are Now Doing By Land and Sea.

TOKIO, Feb. 10.—The Russians continued to bombard Field Marshal Oyama's centre and extreme left on Wednesday and they shelled his extreme right on Thursday.

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 10.—Arrangements have been made for the British steamer Glen Turret to dock and begin loading hay, oats and barley here. It is presumed that the freight is intended for Vladivostok.

NAGASAKI, Feb. 10.—The prize court has adjudicated the Austrian steamer Siam (seized by the Japanese off Hokkaido Jan. 31, while bound from Cardiff for Vladivostok with coal) and her cargo to be a legal prize.

VLADIVOSTOK, Feb. 10.—The daily exodus of non-combatants, women and children has almost emptied Vladivostok. The hosts are not severe and the bay is half free from ice.

IRON WORKS AT ST. PETERSBURG CLOSED—12,000 MEN QUIT ONE FACTORY.

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A VAST INCREASE IS SHOWN

In Building in the Large American Cities.

Compared with the Corresponding Month a Year Ago.

CHICAGO, Feb. 10.—The Construction News tomorrow will say: Building in the principal cities for January shows a remarkable increase compared with the corresponding month a year ago.

In twenty-seven of the leading cities permits were taken out for the construction of 5,187 buildings, involving a total cost of \$24,964,351, against 4,317 buildings involving a total of \$13,975,418 for the same month a year ago.

NINETEEN of the twenty-seven cities show increases varying from 21 to 887 per cent. New York City shows an increase of 299 per cent. Louisville's increase is the enormous percentage of 887.
