

# PRINCIPALS AND SCENES IN COLORADO MINING STRIKE, WHERE FIGHTING EXISTS BETWEEN THE MINERS AND THE STATE TROOPS

The killing of a hundred or more persons—possibly 175—of whom twelve were children and two women, in the Southern Colorado coal fields results from the fight begun last October by the miners' union against the owners. This fight has progressed step by step until a state of armed warfare exists, with the State militia indicted as a confederate of the mine owners. The one cause leading to the trouble, which now calls for the intervention of federal troops, is that the three large companies mining coal in Colorado refuse to recognize the union. They employ union labor, but only as individuals, and testimony has been taken in the State courts to show that they favor non-union labor.

John D. Rockefeller, Jr., controlling the companies involved, has testified before a Congressional committee that "we are prepared to spend our last dollar" before recognizing the union. Shown above are crowds in front of the Rockefeller office, at No. 26 Broadway, New York, where Upton Sinclair, author and socialist, and Miss Freeman were arrested for demonstrations of silent mourning for the slain Colorado miners. Adjutant General Chase is in charge of the United States troops called out to suppress rioting in the Colorado mining strike, and Governor Ammons hopes for an early settlement of the situation.
