Strike Diverts Ships.

Owing to the fishermen's strike at
Boston many of the fishing vessels
and sailing to Gloucester and other
ports with their catches.

Five Vessels for Dependents.

It has been stated that the remain-
ing 40,000 soldiers' dependents now
in England will be sent to Canada on
five of the largest ships in the Atlan-
tic service—the Lapland, Adriatic, Os-
trich, Carmania and Orinda. It has
not been definitely announced whether
the sailings will be made to Halifax
or Quebec, but it will more probably
be the latter port.

Reached Destination.

The schooner John J. Perry which
sailed for New York via Newark,
Connecticut, has arrived at her des-
tination.

Reached Glasgow.

The S. S. Trojan, which sailed from
this port early in the month, grain
laden, arrived at Glasgow last Tues-
day.

Sailed for This Port.

The S. S. Brandon, 1,881 tons, sail-
ing for this port from London last
Tuesday.

Boston Harbour Strike.

For several days Boston harbor has
been tied up by a general strike, par-
ticipated in by both foreign and Am-
erican seamen who are protesting for
the three-watch system. It is esti-
mated that over 1,200 have quit their
posts.

Officials of the Eastern Steamship

Line in Maine have been notified not
to accept shipments of freight to re-
forward on any steamship line out of
Boston or New York. This does not
affect shipments to Boston.

Vessels in Distress.

St. Pierre, Md., July 17.—The steam
trawler Saint Andre, owned by Pe-
camp, France, stranded last night on
St. Pierre Island, in a thick fog, and
today was a total loss. The crew of
twenty-two men were saved. The
Saint Andre carried 1,800 quintals of
fish.

Launched Wednesday.

A boat of champagne, upon which
hundreds of eyes feasted, two bands,
stream whistles and cheers from 2,000
spectators marked the launching at
South Orlington, Maine, last Wed-
nesday of the four-masted schooner
James E. Coburn. The vessel was
launched in a sort of a way Tuesday
but she stuck on the ways and made
progress had to be applied for the next
day's trial, which proved satisfactory.
Unlike most modern products of the
shipyard, the James E. Coburn has
the old-fashioned cable moulding,
curved tailboard, scroll head with
builder's name and an Oldfellow's
emblem on the stern. She is a hardy
