

This is the one day in all the year that can properly lay claim to being rarer than "a day in June." For that reason, if for no other, one ought to know all there is to know about it. Yet where it came from, who created or discovered it, and why it exists at all, are questions that surprisingly few people can answer. To tell its story is to rehearse the history of the calendar through all its amazing shifts and changes, from the days of Romulus down to the present.

The Jewish, Mohammedan, and Greek calendars may be dismissed in a few words. The latter differed greatly in the several states, but they were mostly based on the lumr motions and were altered from time to thue in order to make the lunar and solar years agree. The Attic calendar, for instanc, consisted of twelve months of 354 days, sr months containing thirty and six twenty-hine days. It is, however, the Roman calendar from which ours is lineally descended.
