IN DEFENCE OF THE CONSUMER

Reference was made recently in these columns to the campaign against combines which is being carried on by several Liberal newspapers in Ontario.

The journals referred to are thoroughly impressed with the importance of the big industries, but they do not want to see the consumer squeezed worldly. It is significant that the Toronto World, Mr. W. F. Maclean's newspaper, now joins the movement for the defence of the consumer, asserting that the government should employ the tariff to check monopolistic tendencies in business which directly penalize the great mass of the people.

The World is Conservative and protectionist, but after speaking in support of what it describes as a fair measure of protection, it says:—

"But if the Canadian people have done this in order to encourage the growth of home industries, a corresponding obligation is placed on the manufacturers and traders, who are protected by the tariff.

The people have a right to expect that competition among them will be legitimate and honest, and that no advantage will be taken of the protection afforded by law to extract more than fair and reasonable profits out of the pockets of the consumers. But if unfair advantage is taken, and it can be shown to have been taken, then the tariff that facilitates improper combinations itself affords the means of defence against them.

No combination, unless its monopoly is absolute, or at least relatively absolute, can stand against free outside competition. So, if protected manufacturers or traders combine to enhance prices artificially, the remedy is to suspend the operations of the tariff as regards the articles affected.

"This has been done in New Zealand in similar circumstances, with immediate and decisive consequences, and there should be no hesitation in exercising that effectual remedial measure in Canada whenever it is needed in the public interest. Because the people have been generous in promoting the all-round development of the country does not justify any abuse of the advantages thus given. If outside competition is restricted to benefit Canadian producers and traders, the people are thoroughly entitled to look for fair treatment from them, and if it is not given, to withdraw the protection that has been abused. Canadian combinations will have themselves to thank if public antagonism is aroused to the plea of demanding the application of the swift and summary means of defence which the tariff itself offers to its hand."

Differences in the Conservative party over the question of protection are evidently going to become acute in the near future. During the last campaign we heard little about protection of the old kind—the kind the high protectionists were demanding. Mr. Borden knows that the tariff demands in the public interest. The tariff differences in the party he leads will not be easy to reconcile—and, if high protection is to be no longer the principal Conservative plank, what principle does the party really represent?

THE ISLAND ELECTIONS

Premier Hazard and his Liberal administration have had a somewhat narrow escape in Prince Edward Island. Apparently the administration will have a majority of only two or three in a House of thirty members, a margin which may suffice but which is by no means comfortable proportions.

When the late Premier Peters appealed to the country immediately after the Federal elections of 1904 he was returned to power with two supporters for every one the opposition mastered. It must be remembered, however, that in that year the majority of voters, as a rule, voted below 100 each, in seven cases falling below thirty and in four cases below thirty and in four cases below thirty. The total vote was close then, and it was close in the recent Federal contest.

The Liberals have been in power on the Island for the last seventeen years, a term so long as itself to be an argument in favor of a change in the view of many of the electors; but in the light of the signal Liberal success in the Federal polls it might reasonably have been supposed that Premier Hazard would win with comparative ease. He had two seats by acclamation, in Charlottetown, but Prince county went heavily against him.

Both parties stood strongly for the tunnel project, for better terms generally from the Dominion, for many local improvements, and for the provincial prohibitory law. This prohibitory law is much criticized in some quarters, but it is noteworthy that neither party on the Island ever proposes to repeal it, and that both believe it popular to favor more prohibition instead of less. Mr. Matheson, the opposition leader, perhaps outdid his opponents in the matter of making public demands from the Dominion, but many of the electors seem to have ignored the fact that a Liberal administration, working in harmony with the Laurier government, would be more influential than a local government of the over political stripe. THE INQUEST

The inquest to determine exactly what happened to the Conservative party at the general election a few weeks ago is still being carried on by the Conservative newspapers. The journal which has advanced the most violent theories in its testimony is the Toronto News. Another Conservative witness, the Victoria Colonist, mildly takes the News to task because of the nature of its evidence. The Colonist speaks rather freely on several points. It says, in part:

"The Toronto News devotes a long article to the inquest on the reasons for the Liberal victory at the general election. It attributes it to 'party, money, race and religion.' The News may be right; we do not say it is not. But it strikes us that if the News had not claimed so much credit for the election it would be less irritated at the result. The Conservatives made a good fight on the only issue that was before the people. It was an issue that appealed only to a limited number of the voters, who were not already in sympathy with the party. It was not an issue which promised success. At the beginning of the campaign the Conservative leaders anticipated a substantial reduction of the government majority. Later they became more confident, but we direct attention to Mr. Borden's personal despatch to the Colonist published in this paper on the Sunday preceding the election. It is that despatch Mr. Borden did not claim a victory. He contented himself with saying that his friends claimed one. At the time, when the Conservative leader was in doubt as to the outcome, the News and other Conservative papers were very much of the opinion that the violence of the attack upon the integrity of ministers was also to a large extent responsible for the Liberal victory. The Minister, the arguments employed by the Conservative press of the East were wholly disregarded."

At the Colonist says, the violence of the Conservative attack upon the integrity of the ministers was certainly a boomerang. In this city and province the Conservatives suffered heavily through the Mayes incident and kindred tactics. Mr. Hazen is mainly responsible for that.
