*Governor-General**—His Excellency the Most Honorable HENRY CHARLES KEITH PETTY-FITZMAURICE, G.C.M.G., fifth Marquis of Lansdowne in the Co. of Somerset; Earl of Wycombe, of Chipping Wycombe, Co. Bucks; Viscount Caln and Calnstone, Co. Wilts, and Lord Wycombe, Baron of Chipping Wycombe, Co. Bucks, in the Peerage of Great Britain; Earl of Kerry and Earl of Shelburne, Viscount Clanmaurice and Fitzmaurice, Baron of Kerry, Lixnaw, and Dunkerron, in the Peerage of Irel.; b. 14 Jan., 1845, succeeded his father in 1866; ed. at Eton and Balliol Coll., Oxford; m. 1869, Lady Maud Evelyn Hamilton, youngest dau. of the first Duke of Abercorn, K.G. Was a Commr. of Exchequer of Great Britain, and of Treasury of Irel., 1868-72; Under-Secretary of State for War, 1872-4, and Under-Secretary for India in 1880. Was some time Capt. in Wilts Yeomanry Cavalry. Is a magistrate for Co. of Wilts. Created G.C.M.G. 28 Jan., 1884. Apptd. Governor-General of Canada, 18 Aug., 1883; Sworn in 23 Oct., 1883. (*Salary* £10,000 *stg.*), *Government House, Ottawa.*
