



N.S. TECH STEALS DALHOUSIE TIGER; CHAPTER 2:—DALHOUSIE STEALS TIGER BACK

The unfinished tiger was to have been completed for presentation to the Student's Council last Tuesday.

Notice of the theft was received by the Gazette via the following letter.
