

and His Excellency trusts that they will be able to make a clear arrangement among themselves as will give satisfaction to the Parties concerned in this question.

The Council need not be assembled before June when they receive their presents at Amherstburg; but the Chiefs of the Ottawas and Pottawatomes should have notice that a Council is to be assembled to investigate their claims.

Sir,

I am directed by the Lieut. Governor to acquaint you that you are to proceed to the Townships of Delaware and Caradoc for the purpose of assembling the Chippewas and Munics, now residing on the River Thames, and of communicating the wishes of the Lieut. Governor respecting their future occupations and mode of life.

You will select an eligible spot for a Village and you will commence the important work of civilizing the tribes placed under your charge as soon as possible. You will perceive from the enclosed copy of instructions to Mr. Souders that he has been ordered to form an establishment on Lake Huron and that your arrangements for carrying into effect the system for reforming the habits and customs of the Indians cannot differ materially from those which he has been directed to make at his Station.

In future when you require any articles for the Indians Establishment at Gloston Bay you will make out a Requisition, for them and transmit them to me; and if His Excellency approves of them he will direct the Supt. Comd. General to furnish you with means to complete the purchase proposed.

I am further directed to first you in possession of a copy of Mr. Souders Instructions and to refer you to that part of it which desires him to be particular in keeping his accounts.
