Referring to Your Return for the Month
of February 67 and to Lots 26 and 41 in the town of
Aududon, I have to inform You that conditionally
a sale of Lot 5 in 3rd Can. can be allowed to Mr.
John Pallypice and the sale of this lot in favor of
Charles Jarvis cancelled in consequence of non-payment
of annuities, but the assignment from Catharine Jarvis
can not be recognised. It must however be shown
by affidavit whether Charles Jarvis improved the
lot or if improved by whom the improvements were
made and of what they consisted and their value
and as what time made.

The date of the sale to Mr. Pallypice to be the
6th Sep^r 1849, the date of the first deposit said to
