



Sir,-

I beg to inform you that on the 8th instant a letter was entered in the registered letter book of this department, addressed to "The Anderson Supplies Co., Ltd., Calgary, Alta., and sent to the Post office here for registration and transmission. The Department is today in receipt of a letter from the head office of the firm in Winnipeg asking for explanations in regard to same, the letter evidently having gone to Winnipeg.
