GENERAL VIEW OF TEMPORARY UNIVERSITY PREMISES,

VANCOUVER, B.C.

THE view is taken from the roof of the King Edward High School, looking easterly, across Laurel Street and the front of the General Hospital, toward the head of False Creek and Grandview. The building in the left foreground is the Physics Building, the oldest of the group, and formerly McGill University College. Behind it is shown the Workshop (in white) and at its rear the Mining and Mechanical Engineering Building. The long building, paralleling Laurel Street, is the Commercial Building, devoted to vocational education of returned soldiers. At its left is the Garage and Auto Department, also largely used by soldier students. In the middle foreground is the building housing the Departments of Biology and Geology. At its right (against the tennis-courts) is the Chemistry Building. The three-story white structure is the Arts Building, which also accommodates the Administration Offices, the Library, and the Reading Room. At its left, and connected with it by a corridor, is the Assembly Hall, in which are also three large class-rooms, men's cloak-room, and some offices. Between the Assembly Hall and the Commercial Building there has been erected, since the photograph was taken, a cafeteria for soldier students, completely filling the vacant space on the temporary site. Part of the Vancouver General Hospital is seen at the rear of the Arts Building.
