London Lunatic Asylum.

Receives patients from the counties of Norfolk, Oxford, Elgin, Middlesex, Kent, Essex and Lambton, under same regulations as required of the Provincial Lunatic Asylum, Toronto. Government appoints medical superintendent, who under the supervision of the inspectors, manages the affairs of the asylum.
