ing shipping instructions from the owners. The market for butter is in a rather tight state at present. Receipts of fresh butter are not meeting with a ready sale, and the dealers are cutting and really good fresh-made creamery can be bought today at 26c to 27c a pound. The dealers are firm in their price on fancy held butter, and September and October-made goods are quoted at 25-26c. In fact they could not be sold at less except at a loss. The 2nd-kind butter is meeting with a good demand now and is quoted at from 30c to 31c a pound.

CANADIAN COW MAKING RECORD

From a recent letter from G. A. Brecken, Norwood, Ont., we quote the following which will be of much interest to Canadian Holsteins breeders:

"Our cow 'Countess' is exceeding both in milk and fat all previous records for eight months that I find in the official report of the American Association that between Oct. 1st and Jan. 3rd to date, there is one heifer that is equaling the work that our heifer is now doing, but her record was made just 340 days after calving without breed conditions. No kind of three-year-old or senior three-year-old has equalled the first four days so far concluded in the record. Our heifer is making 10 months after calving and after five months in calf. We are asking her for 400 lbs. of milk testing 3.9 per cent for seven days, and she will just about do it."
