The Archbishop held an Ordination in the Cathedral on Sunday, 20th December, when the following were ordained :—*Priests* : Rev. Gore Mumbee Barrow, Henry Ashton Bracken, Ernest Russell Ladbroke, and Alfred Clinton Collier. *Deacons* : Gerald Sandes Despard, Harry Oswald Nash.

The Treasurer has received per Canon Macnab the sum of \$33 10 for the Sunday School Children's Pier Fund, proceeds of the Winter Entertainment given in the Crypt, December 10th, under the direction of Miss Charlton and Miss Charlotte Sarge. The programme was excellent and thoroughly appreciated by a large audience.

The contributions of the Cathedral Congregation this year for Missionary Work amounts to the splendid sum of one thousand and sixty five dollars, a far larger amount than has been given in any previous year. This of course includes the Pan-Anglican Thank-offering of last June, but for whatever purpose the money was given the sum total shews plainly that our people are beginning to understand more than ever before the Christian obligation of furthering the Missionary cause of the Church.
