A PETITION of several Pilots for and below the Harbour of *Quebec*, whose names are thereunto subscribed, was presented to the House by Mr. *Viger*, and the same was received and read:—SETTING FORTH;—That the Petitioners are informed that there is before the House, a Bill to qualify or licence the number of twenty Masters of Vessels, Coasting Pilots, or Seafaring Men, to act as Pilots for and below the Harbour of *Quebec*.—That they take the liberty to state to the House, that there are, at present, forty-eight Branch Pilots for and below the Harbour of *Quebec*, all of whom are capable of piloting to the Port any ship or vessel coming from sea.—That the Petitioners humbly submit, that if the number of forty-eight Pilots is insufficient, the following reasons ought at least to induce the House to pass a like Bill in favor of the Pilots Apprentices.—1^o That by the Law now in force, the Pilots Apprentices are obliged to serve a regular apprenticeship, for at least five years, under indenture, and to make two or more voyages to *Europe*, or the *West Indies*, in a square rigged vessel, and to speak English
