Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. W. A. Chipman took the Chair,

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair.

The Chairman reported from the Committee, that they had made fome progrety in the business to them referred, and that he was directed by the Committee to move for leave to fit again on the confideration of the fame, which report the Houfe agreed to.

Then the House adjourned until to-morrow, at eleven of the clock.

## PRAYERS.

A Bill to continue the feveral Acts for encouraging the establishment of Schools throughout the Province, was read a fecond time.

Refolved. That the Bill be committed to a committee of the whole Houfe.

A Petition of William Pride and others, Inhabitants of the County of Shelburne, was prefented by Mr. J. I. Chipman, and read, praying an aid for the road from Sable River to Lewes' Head, and from thence paft Spearwater's Tavern, being a diftance of about fourteen miles, as the making the faid road paffable with fafety to cattle and carriages would be of great public utility.

A perition of John Todd was prefented by Mr. Haliburton, and read, fetting forth, that the Petitioner has at a great expense established a Stage Coach and Sleigh, which he has continued to run between Windfor and Halifax, for nearly two years, and praying the aid of the Houfe to enable him to purfue his undertaking, which is acknowledged to be of great public convenience, but unfortunately not beneficial to the Petitioner.

Ordered. That the Petitions do lie on the table.

On motion, the Houle refolved itfelf into a committee of the whole Houle, on the confideration of the Bill to continue the feveral ACts for encouraging the establishment of Schools throughout the Province.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. W. A. Chipman took the Chair,

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair.

The Chairman reported from the Committee, that they had gone through the Bill rethem referred, and that he was directed by the committee to report the fame to the Houfe without any amendment, and he afterwards delivered the Bill in at the Clerk's table.

Ordered. That the Bill be engroffed.

Then the House adjourned until to morrow, at eleven of the clock.
