British Sportsmen Make the Supreme Sacrifice

London, Jan. 15.—(New York Herald cables) Every branch of British sport is represented in latest list issued with the casualties of the conflict—champions at hockey, boxing, swimming, rowing and football have been killed or wounded in action.

Wilfrid G. Vint, killed, was a famous crosswin and created a record at Shrewsbury by steering the eight to victory against Bedford Grammar School five years running, 1909-1914.

Lieut. L. E. King-Stephens, killed, was the well known hockey player of the Teddington Club, for which he acted as secretary for several years. He also played many times in the representative games for the south against north of England.

Swimming has lost a splendid champion in Edward "Ted" Wickham, who has also made the big sacrifice. He scored many of his successes in Australia, notably the Australian 100 yards championship in 5 seconds, at Melbourne, in February 1913 when A. W. Barry was second and W. Longworth third.

The death is also reported of Sergeant E. Glennon, famous middleweight boxer of the Royal Irish Constabulary and the Irish Navy and Army champion.

Sergeant Baker, of the Plymouth Argyle club and Oscar Linkson of Manchester United, both football players, have fallen in action.

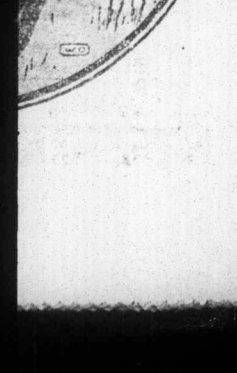

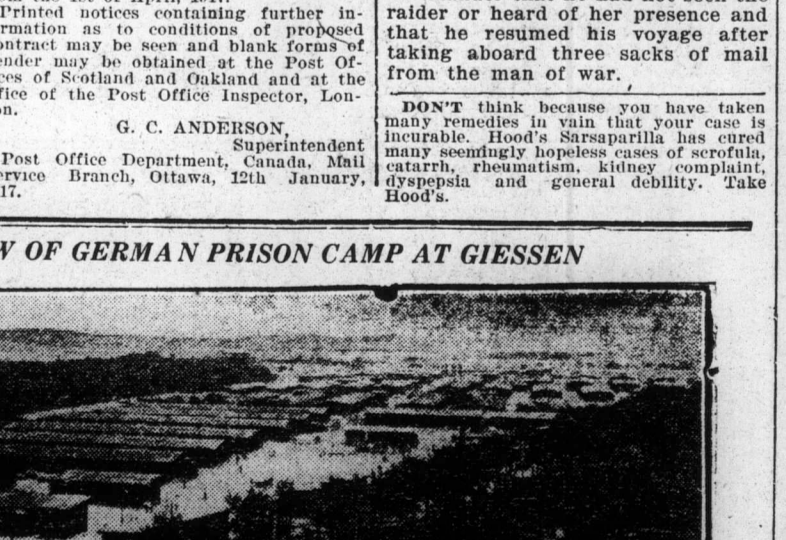
