Notice to Mariners.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the LIGHT-HOUSE which has for some time been in course of erection on Cape Bonavista will be in operation from and after the 11th day of September (proximo) from Sunset to Sunrise for the benefit of Mariners.

This light will burn at an elevation of 150 feet above the level of the Sea, and will revolve at regulated intervals of 2 minutes, exhibiting alternately A RED AND WHITE LIGHT. It will be visible in every direction seaward, and, it is contemplated, may be seen at the distance of Thirty miles.

As a further guide it may be observed that this Light kept open with Spillier's Point will take Vessels clear of the Flowers (sunken rocks) lying between the North head of Catalina, and Bird Island Cove.
