## VEGETINE

## THE LADY FREEMASON.

HER INITIATION INTO THE MYSTERIES OF FREEMASONRY.  
Many tales have been told of the Lady who was made a Freemason, but the following is, I believe, a correct version of the affair: Elizabeth St. Leger, only daughter of the first Viscount Donairle, was born about 1713, she married Richard Aldworth, of Newmarket, county of Cork, son of Sir R. Aldworth, Prevost, Marquis of Munster. A son of a brother who witnessed the coronation and the attendant circumstances of the lady's initiation into the mysteries of Freemasonry, at Donairle House, in Lodge "44" of Ireland, into whose possession the warrant for that initiation passed, supplied the following account of the strange circumstance: The warrant of Lodge 44 was issued in 1715. The Lodge was often under the presidency of Lord Donairle, being held at his residence. On the occasion in point it was held in a room separated from another, as is often the case, by a wall and brickwork. Miss St. Leger, determined to penetrate the mysteries, with a pair of scissors removed a brick from the walls and through the aperture witnessed the two first degrees in Masonry, the extent of the proceeding of the Lodge that evening. Hearing that the brethren were about to separate, she, now terrified, tried to retire noiselessly, but, becoming agitated, nearly fainted. With an effort she rallied, and in the act of withdrawing, knocked over a chair. The Tyler was often under the presidency of Lord Donairle, being held at his residence.
