The Miranda Foundered.

BUT COOK'S EXPEDITION AND THE CREW WERE SAVED.

NORTH SYDNEY, C. B., September 6. Following close upon the wreck of Wellman's Arctic expedition, comes the startling news of the wreck and abandonment of the S. S. Miranda, which on July 7th set out from New York with Dr. Frederick A. Cook's party, bound for Melville Bay and Peary's headquarters. This morning the United States fishing schooner Regal, of Gloucester, Mass., Captain George W. Dixon commanding, put into this harbor with the entire crew and passengers of the Miranda.

THE THRILLING TALE OF THE VOYAGE TO GREENLAND, and its unhappy termination, has caused a profound sensation in this place, but further than that it has not been truly grateful for which all may be truly grateful that along with the misfortune and hardships that have followed the expedition with strange persistence, there has been no loss of life.

With the loss of the Miranda went thousands of dollars worth of property, but further than that the loss has not gone. The story of the voyage as told by one of the passengers of the Miranda is as follows: "Our first serious setback came upon our vessel sailing with an iceberg nine miles north of Belle Isle on the 17th of July. Owing to that accident we were obliged to put back to St. John's for repairs. In the course of about ten days we were again on our way to Greenland, determined to accomplish, as far as possible, what we had set out to do. On the second attempt we struck out directly for Greenland to avoid the large quantities of ice which make the Labrador coast a route full of danger. Heavy fogs of the shore of Greenland, with large trunks of ice, impeded our progress and prevented us from making a harbor. After several days of wearisome delay, however, we sighted land at Supper Toppan, latitude 65 20, on August 7, and were plotted out that harbor by native Kayakers. Two days we spent there visiting the glacier and inland ice and being entertained in a most hospitable way by Governor and Mrs. Mistrup, the Danish officials. On the morning of the 9th of August we weighed anchor and started north. A heavy southerly wind was blowing, and the sea was running high. Capt. Farrell had no recent map of the coast and was thus compelled to guess largely at this course. We had hardly ten outside the harbor when the vessel met with the accident that eventually caused her to be abandoned at sea.

WE STRUCK SQUARELY UPON AN ISLAND ROCK, which we afterwards learned was about three fathoms under water. The heavy sea, however, lifted us up and three times let the vessel fall upon it. The first blow was light and the second much heavier, while the third came with a crash that sent a chill through every one on board. The ship fairly tumbled and every loose article in the staterooms and cabin were thrown about in the utmost confusion. Another wave lifted us up and the Miranda slid off the rock and was free. Capt. Farrell would have started at once for St. John's, but the engineer reported that the vessel was leaking and we were obliged to put back hastily to Supper Toppan. An examination of the hull disclosed the extent of the damage which had been received. The water ballast tank was filled and the stern accordingly well down in the water; the conclusion was that the rock had forced a large hole in the bottom of the boat immediately under the ballast tank. If the aperture had been made a few feet from this to the right or left the Miranda would undoubtedly have filled on the spot and sunk in a short time. As it was, the vessel floated well and the slight leakage reported to come from the other damaged places were easily controlled by the pumps.

THE SERIOUSNESS OF THE SITUATION lay here, however, the entire weight of the boat came upon the top of the ballast tank which was no way intended to stand the strain of such a pressure. As long as this held the Miranda was safe, but if it burst it would only be a matter of time before she would sink. Obviously it was thoroughly unsafe to attempt to return to St. John's without assistance. We earned that Holsborg was some 140 miles distant by the course we must take going. There were some U. S. fishing vessels. This seemed the best course of action. A relief party consisting of Dr. Cook, Messrs. E. G. Th. and Dunning of Yale university; Mr. Porter, of the Boston technology; Mr. Ladd, of Harvard, with five Esquimaux, started north in an open sailboat. Stormy weather prevailed, but the place was reached in five days. By a lucky coincidence, Captain Dixon's boat, the Birge, met with and that skipper generously responded to our appeal for aid. He returned to Supper Toppan with the relief party. Captain Farrell and Captain Dixon agreed upon the sum of \$4,000 as a fair recompense for the loss entailed upon the fishing vessel on account of giving up her trip. This settled, the passengers and crew were at once transferred to the schooner and the Miranda with the Regal in tow started directly across for Labrador. On the second night not 300 miles from Greenland the Miranda set up a signal of distress. A very heavy sea was running and

At 6 o'clock on the morning of August 23rd, the last boat left the Miranda, carrying the captain and the remainder of the crew. We then numbered 91 more on the Regal, a 107 ton schooner, 99 feet long. Our quarters were uncomfortably close and food limited to two months' provisions.
