

Hens will stand inbreding better than the majority of live stock, provided vigorous breeding stock are selected. The trouble generally arises from injudicious breeding, and confinement in

The disease manifests itself in various ways. The birds may be lame, although in apparent health, or they may "go light," losing flesh steadily. although possessing good appetites As this disease is easily communicated to others through droppings and a contaminated atmosphere, any birds affected should be removed and killed. Disinfect the quarters thoroughly, admit plenty of fresh air, and do not us

the birds as breeders. An ounce of prevention being worth a pound of cure, breed from only strong, vigorous stock, particularly on the male side. Let the fowls out on all nice days, and at all times give

The cured herring throughout the trade mestic trade, has been complete since New York importers on the basis of \$23.50 in some cases. A few sales at \$22 f. o. b. St. John's are reported here. These goods probably could not be sold here for less than \$28 or \$30, freight, insurance, overhead expenses, carting and storage considered.
