

Archibald of Harbeur Grace, charging that the Defendant registered, commit a breach of subsection (4) of section (2) Chapter 57 of the Consolidated Statutes, Third leries, entitled "Of Motor Vehicles." charge is as follows-"Every motor car awned or operated within the limits of the town of St. John's shall be registered with the St. John's Municipal Council and the said Council shall assign a separate numher to every car registered with it." Mr. Morine, K.C., who appeared for the defence, proved (1) the Defendant was a resident of Harbour Grace; (2) that he did not own or operate a motor car within the limits of the town of St. John's, and contended that the Defendant's car was not subject to registration under

I hold sub-section (4) under which the prosecution is taken cannot apply to the car driven by the Defendant; Section (2) only compels the registration of motor cars ewned and operated within the limits of the town of St. John's. I therefore dismiss the complaint.
