Fishermen.**St. Johns, Nfld., June 23.—The Brit-
ish warship Mohawk left here sud-
denly before daylight Sunday morn-
ing upon receipt of urgent telegraphic
orders from Commander Burke, com-
manding the flagship Cordelia, direct-
ing her to proceed to White Bay,
where trouble has arisen between
British and French fishermen along
the celebrated French shore.
The French flagship La Clochette and
the British flagship Cordelia met
at Bonne Bay last week and passed
without saluting. Serious friction is
feared during the coming months be-
cause several thousand Newfoundland
and French fishermen are mixing to-
