

HAY AND POTATOES WERE IN DEMAND

LOCAL MARKET.

Today's market was fairly well attended by the farmers and buyers. There was a good demand for hay, oats and potatoes, and prices were firm.

Grain.—There was fully 25 loads of old oats offered, which sold at \$1.50 for most of the loads. A few sales were made at \$1.45 to \$1.47 per cwt. A load of new oats were disposed of at \$1.20 per cwt.

The general opinion among the buyers is that prices will soon be lower. Hay and straw.—Sixteen loads of hay sold quickly at \$10 to \$11 per ton. Straw sold at \$5 and \$5.50 per ton.

Butter and Eggs.—The dealers claimed that prices were easier for butter. Sales were made at 22c and 23c for crocks and 24c for pound rolls. Eggs were plentiful and sales were inclined to be slow at 18c for crates and 19c for smaller lots.

Vegetables and Roots.—Potatoes sold well, and a large quantity could have been disposed of if they had been offered. Sales were made mostly at 90c per bushel; a few lots sold at 80c, and some went as high as \$1 per bushel. Tomatoes were plentiful and were a drug on the market. Prices took a considerable drop at 20c to 25c per basket. Cabbages plentiful at \$4 per dozen. Lettuce, radishes and onion 20c per dozen. Peas sold at 10c to 12c per quart. Celery 40c per dozen. Vegetable marrow, 5c to 8c each for a fair sized one.

Fruits.—Apples were dull and prices lower at 30c to 50c per bushel. Peaches sold at 20c to 50c per bushel. Plums in good demand at 50c to 60c per basket. Peas were held at 90c and 10c per bushel.

The butchers are complaining that they can't get enough of dressed hogs for the local trade. Prices are from \$9 to \$9.25 per cwt.

Butcher Meat.—Veal in good demand at \$8 to \$9 per cwt. Lamb easier at 13c to 14c per pound. Beef drew in price at \$5.50 to \$7 per cwt. There was not much poultry offered. Prices were steady.

RICH DEMAND TICKER AT SEA

Even Private Cruise Fails to Take Minds From Business.

New York, Aug. 10.—The famous annual cruise of the New York Yacht Club, now in progress, has an added feature this year which will be the despair of the cynics. Among the many yachts in the fleet are a number of steamers, and as some of these are as big as ocean liners, and frequently cross the seas, they are supplied with wireless outfits.

Such being the case, their owners are anxious for land stations to send to the yachts the stock market ticker news, and this being received on the steam yachts is passed along by flag code signals to the sailing craft. Now, if you please, consider the situation:

Here are a number of very wealthy men, so wealthy that they can keep in commission large and expensive steam yachts, and are off on a pleasure cruise with the famous company of the New York Yacht Club. Yet these men are also slaves to the ticker that the delight and excitement of yachting, the pleasure of sailing up the beautiful sound, the fun of visiting after anchoring at a port of call, cannot be enjoyed by them without the aid of their taskmaster.

Demand Wireless Reports. They must have wireless reports every minute of how the market is going, not only in New York, but in London, Paris and Berlin. The steamer North Star, flagship of the fleet, was the club's commodore, Cornelius Vanderbilt, and on the big steamer Vandalis was C. K. Billings, who for so long has been the floating palaces with multi-millions aboard, who refuse to allow themselves for any length of time to enjoy the cruise. Why, a couple of clerks who can pool a year's savings and change a 2-foot knobcock get more joy out of their existence than these men.

Plans Startling Flying Machine. Lewis Nixon, formerly an officer of the United States navy and now the head of a big shipbuilding concern, declares that he will soon have ready for trial a heavier-than-air flying machine incorporating a number of novel designs, which he believes will startle the world. This has rather an important sound, as Nixon is a thoroughly practical man and, of course, an accomplished mechanical engineer. He has put his own money into the project and it may be that we shall soon see something here which in the language of the street, will put Mr. Farman's machine on the blink.

Nixon, by the way, is a close personal friend of Richard Croker, the ex-Tammany boss during his visit here, which is slated for early in the fall, will probably urge the naval constructor as the Democratic candidate either for mayor or governor.

Yachtmen Are Entertained. Speaking of the cruise of the New York Yacht Club, the fleet is at Newport today, and as the distinguished and gallant sailors cannot receive any stock reports on the Sabbath, they are visiting the cottage colony socially. It is a long time since so many big dinners have been announced at Newport as are being given for the entertainment of the yachtmen. Eldridge T. Gerry, Mrs. Robert Gould, Mr. and Mrs. Edward J. Berling were among the hostesses who entertained the more socially important yachtmen, and the less socially important, were entertained at the cottages or at the Casino.—E. W. Townsend.

Disorders Are Likely. News of the mayoralty and gubernatorial elections in which the Conservative party scored what is counted a substantial victory goes counter to the pre-election calculations here, and has had a disquieting effect in that it is thought it may make the latter part of Gov. Magoon's administration less serene than has been anticipated. The possibility of a change in the program of the Liberal party would have been more acceptable.

U. S. MAY HAVE TO INTERFERE

Cuban Political Situation Gives Washington Government Much Concern.

Washington, D. C., Aug. 10.—White voters in the United States are struggling with campaign issues, a red hot campaign will be in progress in Cuba for the election of a president, and the candidate elected will probably be inaugurated in February next, when the American troops will be withdrawn, and the provisional government under Governor Magoon terminated.

Returns from the provincial and municipal elections held in Cuba last Sunday were both a surprise and a shock to officials of the state and war departments. The Gov. Magoon was instructed to maintain an absolutely impartial attitude in his dealing with the contentious Cuban politicians, there is a feeling that from the viewpoint of the Washington Government, the success of the Liberal party would have been more acceptable.

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TRAIN RAN INTO BURNED BRIDGE

The North Coast Limited Was Wrecked While Travelling at High Speed.

Glendive, Mont., Aug. 11.—Northern Pacific train No. 2 the North Coast Limited, met with a disastrous wreck 12 miles west of Glendive last night. Fireman A. B. Matthews and an unknown tramp were killed and 30 persons injured. Few of those injured were seriously hurt, and all but one, Wilson, an express messenger will recover.

The train was traveling probably at a speed of 50 miles an hour when within two miles of Allard station it rounded a curve and ran into a burned bridge 150 feet long. Engineer Litch could not see that the structure was gone until the train was virtually over the chasm. When he did see it he quickly reversed the engine and threw on the emergency brakes, which action prevented all the coaches except the smoker and mail car from going into the ditch.

A relief train bearing physicians left this city at once for the scene, and a wrecking train was made up and is now at work clearing the track. The dead, together with all the injured were brought to Glendive and are now being cared for.

The dead: A. B. Matthews, fireman, Dickinson, N.D.; unknown tramp. The most seriously injured are: C. D. Litch, engineer; J. B. Wilson, express messenger, fatally scalded by steam; H. Oliver.

coast to coast, which was hailed with delight by the strikers. Later in the day the first of these reports came to hand, and in part was as follows:

Strikers' Report. "The trains in the west are late coming in and going out, and the company in their bulletins explain that this was due to an unfortunate wreck. The company have also sent agents to canvass the boarding-house district in Winnipeg in an effort to persuade the unemployed that they could provide them with permanent positions. This new venture has not been a complete success so far as getting strike-breakers is concerned. Not a single man has deserted the ranks, and the prospects are promising for the strikers' victory."

To keep in close touch with the general situation in the local and neighboring divisions representatives came here yesterday from London, Havelock and Muskego, and addressed the strikers on the situation of the strike at these points. At the meeting it was announced that the company had made overtures to some of the strikers, who are considered specialists in the different departments in the west, that they would be paid for their services for three weeks.

WIN FOR LEMIEUX ACT The Chignecto Mines Dispute is Settled.

Halifax, Aug. 10.—Some weeks ago the miners and other operators at Chignecto mines, operated by the Maritime Coal, Railway and Power Company, asked for the appointment of a conciliation board under the Lemieux act, to settle several questions at variance between the men and the management at that colliery. As a result Rev. C. W. Wilson, chairman, B. B. Barnhill, representing the company, and R. B. Murray, representing the men, were appointed. The arbitrators met two weeks ago, and after sitting for nearly a week drafted a report, which was decidedly in favor of the men. This evening a committee of the men met Manager David Mitchell to consider the finding. The conference was of a most pleasing character, and after discussion of the matter both parties signed the award. This harmonious settlement is regarded as a great victory for the Lemieux act.

Crowded With Passengers. Both cars were loaded heavily with passengers. The people were standing on the steps and in the vestibules of the cars. At the first crash the ends of both cars were torn away and the people were tipped off on to the track. When No. 8 came back to the rebound it ran over the people who had fallen from both coaches, tearing limbs and mangling bodies. After the second crash Conductor Brehard alighted from the car and pulled off the trolley pole and this prevented further damage.

The remainder of the passengers after getting to work picking up the injured from beneath the wheels of the coaches. Doctors and ambulances were soon on the ground, but the work of clearing the track lasted until 11 o'clock,
