The important point of the essay was that arbitrators are not advocates. They occupy the position of judges and should act impartially on the evidence. They are empowered to decide on all points bota of law and fact. They are in a similar position to law and fact. They are in a similar position to umpires and referees, and should guard against any possible imputation of partiality. Arbitrators should not be accessible to outside influence. They have, too, the power to cross-examine witnesses. The president quoted from a standard work, "Russell on Arbitration," in support of his position, and that if arbitrators act as agents they act corruptly.
