

The price is too low to expect much of si decline, but unless our exports increase or receipts fall off we will lose the premium of December before that month comes. The recommendations to buy and hold wheat are its low price and a large quantity being fed to cattle, horses and hoge-some talk of 100,000, 000 being fed. If they feed one-half wheat should be good for a 15c advance. If they feed 100,000,000 it will sell at \$1 a bushel before another crop. We are skeptical about this great feeding demand, and can only hope it will turn out to be true.

Corn started strong and active, the light deliveries causing an urgent demand for September, which advanced sharply and carried May with it. There was some outside buying on dry weather.
