

BOSANQUET COUNCIL

Council met on the 1st inst. All the members present. Minutes of last meeting read and confirmed. Mr. Shepherd was appointed commissioner to have the Malley drain repaired. Walter Rawlings complained of water from the 16th and L. R. concessions damaging his land, and Mr. Shepherd was instructed to have G. A. McCubbin, C.E., examine and if possible adjust the grievance. The clerk was instructed to insert in the local newspapers a notice that the owners of cattle permitting them to run at large on the public highways will be fined at least \$1 for each head. The following orders were given: John G. Elliott and Oswald Sitter, \$6 each assisting engineer on Nesbit dr; Bruce Thomson \$243.20 for road scraper; Wm. Griggs \$42.30 and H. C. Baird \$357.44 for tile for roads, S. Christmas \$112.25 ditching on roads; J. H. Campbell \$185, salary as assessor and postage; G. Sutherland \$175.00 on salary; Geo. Valentine \$13 for 325 of 4-inch tile for road; O. S. Walden \$15 serving copies of engineer's report for improvement of the Canada Co. canal and Ira Brooks \$2 refund of dog tax for 1921 having been assessed for a bitch instead of a dog. Council will meet on Monday, June 5th, at 10 a.m. at a Court of Revision on the assessment roll and for general business. Geo. Sutherland, Clerk.

BROOKE COUNCIL

Alvinston, May 6th, 1922 Council met pursuant to adjournment. Members all present. Minutes of former meeting read and on motion of Loosemore—Sutton, were adopted. Report of A. S. Code, O.L.S., C.E., read on the proposed repairs to the Campbell drain, estimated cost \$480. Mr. Robert Ward, one of the interested ratepayers was present at the reading of the report. Campbell—Loosemore, that report be adopted and by-law be prepared authorizing work and loan.—Carried. Report of A. S. Code, O.L.S., read on the proposed repairs to the Loosemore drain. Estimated cost \$660.00. Mr. Norman Zavitz, one of the interested tax payers was present at reading of the report. Campbell—Sutton, that report be adopted and bylaw be prepared authorizing work and loan.—Carried. Loosemore—Sutton, that Amos Kelly be paid \$86.00 for sheep killed and injured by dogs.—Carried. McLean—Campbell, that Township adopt the System re Government aid to roads and the expenditures of the moneys be under the direction of the Commissioners for the several Divisions.—Carried. By-law submitted and read to provide for expenditures on roads in the Township during the year 1922. Sutton—McLean, that blanks in by-law to provide for expenditures be filed in as follows: Road construction \$8,000.00; Bridge construction \$12,000; Machinery \$500; Maintenance and repair of roads \$8,000, a total of \$26,500. McLean—Campbell, that bylaw be read a third time and finally passed.—Carried. Mr. James Gander, owner of N 1/2 lot 4, con. 8, made application for a loan of \$500 under the terms of "The Tile Drainage Act." Campbell—Sutton, that application be entertained and by-law be prepared to impose a special drainage rate on N 1/2, lot 4, Con. 8, and Reeve authorized to issue debentures to the amount asked for.—Carried.

By-law to impose a tile drainage rate upon N 1/2, Lot 4, Con. 8, submitted and read. Loosemore—McLean, that bylaw be read a third time and finally passed.—Carried. Loosemore—Sutton, that bylaws be prepared authorizing the issue of debentures for the levy and collection upon subscribers to the Brooke Municipal Telephone System, for the sum of fifteen thousand dollars, (\$15000) to repay Brooke Township for deficit incurred against the System and repairing of the lines damaged by storm.—Carried.

By-laws authorizing repairs to Wallis drain, Campbell and Loosemore drains and to borrow on the credit of the Municipality the funds necessary for the work. McLean—Sutton, that by-laws be provisionally adopted, printed in pamphlet form, with a copy served on each party assessed, with a court of revision on each drain be held in Inwood on Saturday, the 3rd day of June, 1922. Loosemore drain to open at 10.30 o'clock a.m., A. E. Loosemore to be Commissioner. Wallis drain to open at 3 o'clock p.m. L. Lindsay, Commissioner. Campbell drain to open at 4 o'clock p.m., D. M. Campbell to be commissioner.—Carried.

Campbell—Sutton, that Council do now adjourn to meet in Inwood on Saturday the 3rd of June, 1922, to open as a Court of Revision on Assessment Roll, at 2 o'clock p.m.—Carried. W. J. Weed, Clerk.


