with an aspirate sound to the first, owing to the presence of h, which is always more or less aspirated.

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All the consonants must be sounded : namas, fish; môlsem, wolf; abon, bed. There is no exception.

When a consonant (so as a vowel) is doubled—thus: bb, nn, tt—the two letters are to be sounded as one, the sound being prolonged; as in the following sentence: n'winowôziibba nitta, I should have petitioned forthwith.

The Nowels are sounded as in the following scale :

A as in master : abaznoda, basket; E as in label : pelaz, pigeon;

I as in indian : liguônsôgan, thimble ;

O as in notice : todosnôbo, milk ;

U is sounded as u in union: 1. When it occurs alone; 2. When it is first in a word; 3. When it is preceded by *i*: u nio,
