thern cities of China, at which there is a gate in the Great Wall, and they work among the Mongols as well as Chinese. There is a large school for girls, an hospital for women, and the lady doctor goes out on tours on the plains, taking her tent and necessaries with her, and putting in, she says, three weeks at a time of as hard work and as much discomfort as can wellbe imagined.
