GENERAL HOSPITAL, TORONTO.

WE have been given to understand that the Trustees of the General Hospital have it in contemplation to make some important alterations in this Institution: what the exact nature of those changes are to be, we are not yet authorised to state. Deriving a pretty good income (something like £100 per annum) from Students fees, it has been deemed necessary to make provision for lessening the pressure which has been thrown on the present Staff by the great increase of Students, by appointing other officers to aid in the responsible duties which devolve on the Hospital attendants. The Honble Dr. Widmer zealous and active as ever in the discharge of his duties, has, we believe, been mainly instrumental in effecting this desirable change; and it is to be hoped that the good intentions of the Trustees will be carried out by the combined exertions of the Old Staff, and those new Members yet to be appointed. If actuated by a sincere love for Science, the Members of the Staff of the General Hospital may effect much towards the advancement of the Medical Profession in this Province; let the moral and intellectual advancement of that Profession be their grand aim; and all minor difficulties and hindrances, to harmonious and hearty co-operation will vanish.
