THE HEATHEN.

REV. H. M. SCUDDER, D. D., of Chicago, writes in The Advanced as follows in regard to the heathen:-

"4 There is a command in the New Testament to go and disciple all the heathen nations in the name of this Deliverer.

"5 This command emanates from the supreme authority. It is from the lips of Christ himself-

This command is addressed to all Christians, in every age, until every human being is converted. The command and the promise reach unto the end.

"7. The missionary spirit is the spirit of Christ. The soul or the church that does not possess it is dead.

'9. If we love the truth of Christ we shall be intent upon its proclamation till every false religion is vanquished by it.

"10. We are not Jews, but Gentiles. Our lineage is heathen. The missionary enterprise rescued us from paganism Gratitude for our own emancipation and love for our brethren, the heathen of all countries, should move us with a mighty impulse to engage in missionary work.

"11. Success is certain. The Lord has promised it. The apostles illustrated it. Those twelve men were missionaries. In their time, Rome, with her military force, ruled the bodies of men; and Greece with her philosophy, ruled their spirits. Both arose in enmity to the Cross. The little band of apostles did not


fear nor falter. They conquered both.
"12. We ourselves are the offspring of the missionary enterprise. To turn against it is like man's turning

against his own mother.

"13. Duty, Love Success—these are three magic words. Let us grasp the ideas they suggest, and pray and work for all men, at home and abroad until the Church absorbs the whole world, and rise up into the millennial lory."
