

A ONE-MAN MEDICAL FACULTY.
—Dr. Dunglison writes in the *College and Clinical Record* that the late Prof. Robley Dunglison, of Jefferson Medical College, when invited by the representative of Thomas Jefferson, then rector of the University of Virginia, to leave England to assume the duties of a professorship—or rather a combination of professorships—in that school entered into a contract: “To teach to the best of his ability and with due diligence, anatomy, surgery, the history of the progress and theories of medicine, physiology, materia medica, and pharmacy.” At the time he was invited to take upon himself this task he was but twenty-six years of age.
