- (1) Without waiting any longer in the hope of reaching agreement on the basic differences of opinion with respect to general principles, we should seek to embodying this area of agreement already reached by resolution which can serve as a benchmark upon which decisions by the Assembly with respect to future assessments for peace-keeping operations should be made.
 - our immediate and pressing task is to provide the funds necessary to maintain UNEF and ONUC in the months immediately ahead. We believe it should be possible to reach agreement on the necessary financial modalities consistent with the general principles which I have already mentioned.
