

- Bread made with the use of yeast as a leavening substance (Schedule A 0484010).
- Biscuits, cakes, pastry, and similar baked products including inedible wafers (Schedule A 0484020).

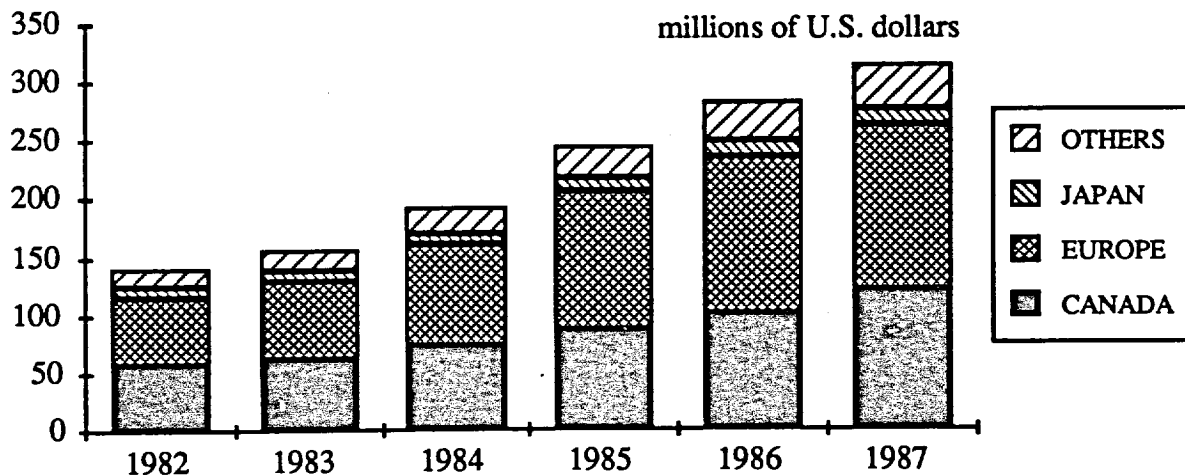
U.S. IMPORTS 1982-87

A breakdown of 1987 imports of selected bakery products by country is presented in Appendix 4. Europe accounted for 45.8% of total U.S. imports in 1987. The primary suppliers were Denmark (16.5%) and West Germany (8.1%).

The continuing increase of imports from foreign countries provides an indication of the changing market within the United States for bakery products. Between 1982 and 1987, total U.S. imports of bakery products increased from \$141.7 million (U.S.) to \$317.1 million (U.S.) (See Chart 1, below). Appendix 5 illustrates the value of imports between 1982 and 1987 for each individual product group.
