

Mr. Gardiner, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, then laid before the House,—Copy of Order in Council P.C. 1512, approved March 13, 1952: Revoking Order in Council P.C. 1028 of February 19, 1952, which provided for the establishment of a quarantine area in certain parts of the Province of Saskatchewan in respect of the outbreak of foot and mouth disease in the said Province.

Also,—Copy of Ministerial Order No. 1, dated March 13, 1952, and signed by the Minister of Agriculture: Declaring that an outbreak of foot and mouth disease has occurred in the Province of Saskatchewan and that certain animals are likely to be affected thereby, and re-establishing a quarantine area in the said Province.

And also,—Copy of Order in Council P.C. 1513, approved March 13, 1952: Prohibiting the movement, without the permission of an inspector or such other person as the Minister of Agriculture may designate, of any flesh, hides, hoofs, horns or other parts of any cattle, sheep, goats, other ruminants and swine into the quarantined area of the Province of Saskatchewan.

The House then resumed the Debate on the proposed motion of Mr. George for an Address to His Excellency the Governor General in Reply to His Speech at the Opening of the Session, and on the proposed motion of Mr. Fair in amendment thereto, and on the proposed motion of Mr. Bryce in amendment to the said proposed amendment.

And the Debate still continuing; the said Debate was, on motion of Mr. Adamson, adjourned.

At eleven o'clock, p.m., Mr. Speaker adjourned the House without question put, pursuant to Standing Order 7, until tomorrow, at three o'clock, p.m.
