

Conservation of the Natural Resources of Canada:

1. House to go into Committee of the Whole to consider a proposed Resolution to establish a Commission for the Conservation of the Natural Resources of Canada, 750. His Excellency's recommendation signified, 751. In Committee Resolution adopted; reported; agreed to and referred to Committee of the Whole on following Bill, 843.
2. Bill No. 159, An Act to create a Permanent Commission on the Conservation of the Natural Resources of Canada: Mr. Fisher, 722. Resolution adopted; referred, 843. Read second time; considered in Committee of the Whole (together with Resolution adopted in Committee), reported without amendment; read third time and passed, 843. Passed by Senate, 882. Royal Assent, 931.—9 Edward VII., Chapter 27.

Again considered; reported amended; considered as amended; read third time; passed, 882. Passed by the Senate, with amendments; agreed to, 929. Royal Assent, 932.—9 Edward VII., Chapter 9.
2. Bill No. 4, An Act to amend the Criminal Code: Mr. Bickerdike, 38. Read second time; considered in Committee of the Whole; progress reported, 124.
3. Bill No. 60, An Act to amend the Criminal Code respecting injuries to persons due to motor vehicles: Mr. Lewis, 180.
