BY EXTENDING WATER

Toronto Will Now Extend Pipes Five Hundred Feet to Serve One House.

One in the Number Decides in Land butchers have had a dot of attention paid to them. Their hasty, easy methods of disposing of property were decried. Everyone interested in real esttae knew that if that practice of selling land continued very much longer disastrous conditions were liable to arise. The city made one move to put a check on free and easy methods by its five mile radius subdivision act. But that seemingly was the end of its endeavors to encourage straightforendeavors to encourage straightforward progressive suburban land busi-

The first project that swings toward modern and meritorious realty methods has actually met a rebuff from that part of the city council composing the works committee McEachrens asked for a water supply for one hundred houses they are building on a subdivision on Sampion at the part of the city council composing the works of the city council coun

dred feet from Danforth avenue and the city limits and this committee refused their application. The city will extend its service five hundred feet from the limits to serve one house. But extend the pipes a couple of hundred feet farther to serve a hundred houses, no. "Let them dig wells." says Ald. Dunn, who last year voted to extend water service out to Davies 2700 feet.

If they can get water, and they are willing to pay the regular outside charges (24 cents for water that costs the city 6.15 cents) and pay for the pipes and put them in according to the city's direction. McEachrens will in all likelihood put up five hundred houses. A hundred houses anyway is only a start on their building program, and other owners encourgaed would fall in line.

Some of the works committee who voted down the application made the plea that the city shouldn't encourage the building of houses outside the limits. But the city's whole policy has been one to discourage the building of workingments houses inside the limits. There is no \$25 a foot building land in Toronto's borders today. Houses that McEachrens want to put up can't be built on \$40 and \$50 a foot land and then sold at \$2000 to \$2500 each on easy payments. Small houses of this kind are the greatest need that Toronto knows. The council recognized this when they guaranteed nearly a million dollars worth of housing company dollars worth of housing company bonds. And if the city wants to reap the benefit of the taxes on these houses they merely have to reach out and bring them in the city.
