Mr. Redpath being called to the chair, requested Mr. Rogers to  
open the meeting with prayer. Mr. J. C. Becket was appointed Secre-  
tary. The minutes of last meeting, approving of the Union, were read  
and confirmed.

The Chairman stated that the Sub-Committee appointed at last  
meeting had prepared the following Resolutions for the consideration  
of this meeting :—

*Resolved,* 1. That it is the unanimous judgment of this meeting, that  
whatever differences of opinion may have existed, at the time of the disruption  
of the Church of Scotland for following the same course in Canada, the period  
has arrived when the Church in this country, can be united with great advantage  
to the interests of Christianity, especially of our common faith, and without in-  
terference with the conscientious convictions of any of its members.

2. That this desirable end may be accomplished in accordance with Pres-  
byterian principles, the Elders now present agree to bring the subject before  
their respective sessions, for their consideration, and with a view to general  
Sessional approval of such proposed Union; and they also pledged themselves,  
to use every other possible and legitimate method to bring about its consum-  
mation.

3. That this meeting is encouraged and fortified in the steps which it has  
now taken, by the example and experience of their Presbyterian brethren in  
Australia, who have been lately united into one body, under one General As-  
sembly with the approval of the Supreme Ecclesiastical Courts in Scotland.

4. That a joint Committee of Elders be and is hereby appointed to issue  
these resolutions to all office-bearers of the Presbyterian Congregations in Ca-  
nada, with a view to obtain a general expression of opinion upon the subject
