WILL BE WARM FIGHT UP IN NORTH TORONTO

Vote Polled Will Be Heaviest Ever -Annexation Likely to Carry -Suburban Doings.

NORTH TORONTO, Jan. 1.—(Special.)—At the last moment and too late to counteract, even if considered worthy in the ordinary way, Mr. Murphy, one of the candidates for the mayoralty office, has issued a circular reflecting generally on the course adopted by the mayor, and dealing vaguely with charges of collusion on the part of the chief magistrate.

Charges Unfair. The charges leveled against Mayor Brown by Mr. Murphy are so void of reason as really not to merit any consideration. No man who ever occupied the mayoralty chair in the Town of North Toronto has kept himself more scrupulously aloof from all alliances than A. J. Brown. He has been approached with a view to this end, but has steadily refused and stands to-day absolutely untrammelled. One thing he has never done is to deliberately in the face of public opinion, and the openly expressed wish of the ratepayers, throw down a by-law when once endorsed by the electors.

Good Men All. Of the members of the council, the ratepayers have seldom, if ever, been more highly opinionated in the matter of municipal honors and responsibilities. In Walter Muston the electors have a man of probity, of good business ability, and an indefatigable worker in committee and council alike, he is a sound adviser, and his judgment has never been called in question. His return is practically assured.

Some New Men. John P. Patterson is a new aspirant for municipal honors, but it is safe to say that few men have ever come more rapidly to the front. His clear-cut statement of Saturday with respect to his business relations has immensely strengthened his position, and it seems to be morally certain that he will win a seat at the next council board.

Will Scarborough Go "Dry"? Reports from Scarborough Township, where a local option fight is in progress, all seem to indicate that a substantial majority is in favor of the "dry" measure. An exciting campaign is being carried on, and it looks as tho, with favorable weather to the history of the municipality will be brought out. The friends of local option have carried on an aggressive fight, have held a number of meetings, and lined up their forces for the struggle. Opponents of the measure have likewise been active, but it is generally admitted that Scarborough will soon be "dry."

Annexation Will Carry. As to the by-laws, if there is one that is more entitled to support and likely to carry than any other it is the annexation. A feature of the whole campaign is the fact that the annexation of W. G. Ellis and Mr. Richardson has been little or no open cover attack on the part of the opponents. It has been well received, and it looks now as tho it will carry.





A BIG UNDERTAKING.
