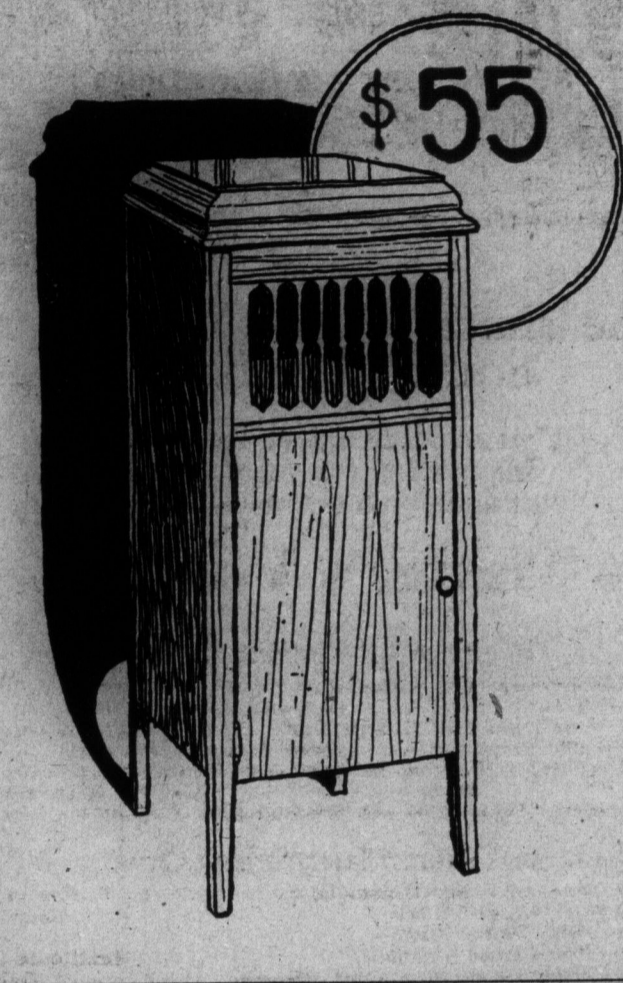

## CROWDED SCHOOLS VITAL PROBLEM

Plans for Additions Need Revision Amounting to Thousands.

Sharp animated talk on overcrowding marked the meeting of the board of education management committee yesterday afternoon. The room was thronged by trustees, members of deputations and representatives of building firms.

Dr. John Noble, chairman, and the trustees regarded the board of control as a large extent responsible for the shortage of school buildings. The committee decided to have a double portable school building erected at Roden School.

Hot Shot Exchanged. Hot shot was exchanged between Dr. John Noble, chairman of the committee, and Trustee T. Bell over the plans for the additions to Norway, Carlton, Wilkinson and Duke of Connaught public schools.

## REGULATED RENTS INCREASE EVIL

Real Estate Expert Shows Fallacy of Ten Per Cent. Profit Legislation.

J. Knox Thompson, who has been in the real estate business in Toronto about 45 years, thinks the attempt to regulate rents will do more harm than good. He admits that a number of landlords have been over-grasping, but in limiting rentals to 10 per cent. of the value of the premises he thinks building operations, which in time will make the housing situation more acute.

Train Children in Fire Fighting. Education Department Arranges Practical Instruction for the Schools.

Chief Gillespie congratulated the minister on what he had already done in seeking to further the interest in fire protection among the school children of Ontario. He also referred in his letter to a campaign he had conducted in Brockville with the boy scouts. He had given them lectures and taken them to the fire station where he showed them the fire fighting apparatus.

Cancer Swells List of Toronto Deaths. According to the medical officer's report cancer and other malignant tumors caused the greater number of deaths in Toronto last month when 276 persons, or 8.6 per 1,000 of the population died, as compared with 401, or 9.7 of the population in August, 1918.
