didate, East Hamilton. Hamilton, Nov. 19.-(Staff Special.)-The approaching by-election in East Hamilton will attract widespread in-terest far beyond the limits of Ontario. The Liberals have decided to place no candidate in the field. The Con-servatives have a candidate who is strong in his convictions and fearless in expressing them, and who declares himself for "Hamilton first and the Conservative party afterwards." The new labor party has nominated a man who for a lifetime has ignored the two historic parties of Canada. He stands squarely upon the platform re-cently adopted at Vancouver. He has been a resident of New Zealand and Australia,and, while not unpracticable, his ideal is to be found in those coun-tries where great wealth and great poverty are alike unknown. J. J.
