NEW HOCKEY ASSOCIATION LONDON MAKES A CIRCUIT

Findlay of Montreal Sends Out Circular Advocating Mixing of Pros. and Amateurs.

London, Feb. 7.—The present drift of affairs in the hockey world has resulted in a movement in this city towards the organization of a new association, which will accept the definition of an amateur as laid down by the athletic bodies of the east and which permits amateurs to play with the best of the professionals without affecting their status as amateurs. This move has not been undertaken without due consideration and considerable encouragement from Western Ontario enthusiasts.

It is expected to organize Woodstock, Guelph, Brantford, London, Galt and possibly Berlin and St. Thomas at once into a senior series from the encouragement received from various clubs of the province will be in full swing by next winter.

W. E. Findlay of Montreal has sent the following letter to the leading clubs of Western Ontario:

Dear Sir,—It is evident to all those interested in the game of hockey in Western Ontario that conditions favor the organization of an association which permits in that section, under the amended definition of an amateur, which permits to play with or against professionals without losing his amateur status.

It is proposed to form an association formed along these lines would control its own destinies, and the interest of the amateur would be well looked after, and the senior, intermediate and junior series be remedied to suit circumstances.

Secondly, in the senior series a club found it necessary to play a mixed team of amateurs and professionals. They would be so without any harm being done, and we would keep our good talent here instead of allowing it to drift to the outside clubs, which would be a great loss to the game. Now, in this connection, let me impress upon you that it would not be an advantage to have purely professional teams, but simply to prevent the evils and injustices of common sense resulted from the lack of uniformity in the conditions as they exist today. It is not absurd that if two professional clubs have an objection to playing the game, they should be suspended as ever until they are re-admitted as amateurs. It is whether he has received any remuneration whatsoever for his services on the team.

In the east the league is a mixed one, which "professionals" have both amateurs and professionals on their team. The "Victorias" and "Montreal" are all amateurs. The "Oshawa" are all professionals. Now these four teams are playing against each other, and no harm resulted from it. Why should we not do the same in Western Ontario? We have no objection to having a mixed team, but the purpose of this is to prevent the evils of such an association, and if your club is favorably inclined, why should we not do the same?
