POLITICAL LIFE IS HARD WHEN A REMEDIAL BILL IS UNDER CONSIDERATION. The House of Commons is Now in Constant Session, But Very Little Headway is Being Made in Committee—The Opponents of the Bill are Fighting Tooth and Nail.

SEVENTH PARAGRAPH EAR GREENWAY'S RESIGNATION

Is to Get into the Dominion Cabinet. PROVINCIAL PREMIERS COMBINE To Help the Liberal Leader in the Coming Elections.

Manitoba's Premier will Forgive His Office for His Prospects at Ottawa—Sifton to be His Successor—The Prospects of Martin's Resignation from Politics—Greenway will Probably Run for the New Constituency of Elgin.

Winnipeg, Man., April 7.—(Special)—Premier Greenway left today for Toronto, ostensibly on "remedial business." It is understood, however, his mission is more of a political than departmental nature. It is hinted that Manitoba's Premier will join those of Ontario, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick in a grand effort at the coming Federal elections to place Mr. Laurier at the head of affairs at Ottawa.

So far as Manitoba's part of the scheme is concerned, it is said that Mr. Greenway has been prevailed upon to forsake his present position for the prospect of becoming Minister of the Interior and Immigration in the Liberal Government.

Mr. Greenway's special fitness for a position is undoubtedly good, besides which he is a shrewd politician and would command a strong following from the west.

This move is the secret of Mr. Martin's retirement from politics. While Mr. Martin's ability and aggressiveness have brought him into prominence, it is no secret that he is a poor administrator, and an inferior administrator.

Such a man, at least, is his record in the Provincial Cabinet. Mr. Martin, of course, is not being squeezed out, as sufficient legal business will be thrown in his way to compensate him for the relinquishing of the prospective emoluments of office. This, too, is more to Mr. Martin's taste.

Mr. Greenway's resignation has looked carefully after the new constituency of Elgin for some time past. Mr. McLeod, the candidate for the seat, has retired to make way for Mr. Greenway, but owing to the turn of events just at the time of the second election, it was not considered expedient for Mr. Greenway to accept the nomination.

Editor of the "Toronto Globe," stepped into the breach. He, however, has no desire for Parliamentary honors, and would gladly give way for such a strong local man as Mr. Greenway is, particularly as by doing so he would increase his own popularity in the province by entering Parliament.

The reconstruction of the Manitoba way's transferred to the Federal Government, consequently to the Federal arena, will, no doubt, result in the promotion of Attorney-General, and the succession of Speaker Young to the portfolio of Agriculture. The latter is a very popular man, representing the constituency adjoining the one now represented by Mr. Greenway.

Mr. Greenway would have the support of the "solid south." Your correspondent cannot say that this information is correct, but it is given good authority and backed by several corroborative incidents.

REV. DR. CARSON SCUMMBS

The Canadian Pastor of Jefferson-Avenue Church, Detroit, Taken Off by Typhoid. Detroit, April 7.—The Rev. W. W. Carson, D.D., of the Jefferson-Avenue Presbyterian Church, died this morning of typhoid fever.

The funeral will take place in Toronto on Friday.

The Rev. Dr. Carson was born Jan. 7, 1846, in the Township of Osgoode, Carleton County, Ontario, his parents being Thomas and Maria Carson. He was educated at Ottawa Grammar School and at the Iroquois Academy, in which he was for some years a teacher. After a course in theology he was in 1872 called to the ministry of the Methodist Episcopal Church, being ordained in the late Rev. Dr. Morley Punshon in 1871.

His first charge after ordination was the First Methodist Church, Detroit, Michigan. He afterward held his charge the Brant-avenue Church, Brantford; Woodstock Central Church; Centenary Church, Hamilton; Dominion Church, Ottawa; Toronto, Yonge-street north; the Elm-street Church, in Kingston; and, going to Sydneyham street Church there to the Jefferson-avenue Presbyterian Church in Detroit.

Carson was successful in every field in which he labored, was broadminded and tolerant and greatly esteemed in Methodist circles in Canada.

Regret at Ottawa. Ottawa, April 7.—(Special)—News of Rev. Dr. Carson's death at Detroit was received here with expressions of regret. He was the pastor of three years in Dominion Methodist Church. Mr. Carson was many friends by his genial disposition, and was pastor of Dominion Methodist Church in this city from 1888 to 1889, going from Ottawa to Kingston, Ontario, in 1887.

It was noted for his broad views in religious matters and his religious-scientific cast of his sermons.
