Liverpool Market Less Strong Than Ontario and Manitoba Prices Butter, choice, tubs. Keep Rising - Peas and Corn

Tuesday Evening, Oct. 25.

It was no doubt partly owing to the abatement of the war scare that the world's wheat markets to-day failed to exhibit the strength that characterized them yesterday. Liverpool wheat futures opened very strong this morning at an advance of nearly a penny over night, but ensed off on the better foreign outlook closing unchanged to ½d per cental higher than yesterday's final figures. Spot wheat however, rose a net ½d to 2d for the day. Parls wheat advanced 5 centimes, and flour 20 to 25 centimes.

Ohicago's wheat market opened heavy and continued so all day, closing at a decline of about 2c per bushel for all deliveries, as compared with the previous final figures. Speculators realized on their purchases of the past few days. About 80 loads were reported worked for export. A feature of the day has been the strength of cash wheat, as compared with futures.
