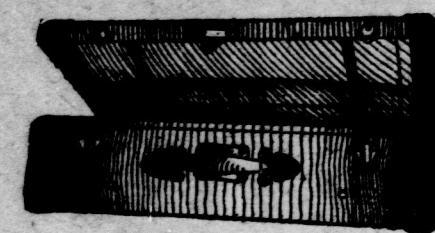

NEWS OF PORT STANLEY
A Number of New Buildings To Be Erected During the Fall.

Port Stanley, Sept. 5.—E. J. Edy and family have returned to London from Orchard Beach.

Miss Louise Terry has left for her home in Brantford.

Miss Phillips, of Toronto, has assumed duty here as assistant in the public school.

Mrs. A. J. Clark and family returned home to London yesterday.

The new cottage on Stanley Beach, built by the Bennett & Ferguson Company, has been purchased by Mr. Morley Riley, of the Canadian Pacific. The Bennett-Ferguson Company are contracting for the erection of a number of similar buildings on their property, and expect to have them completed before Christmas.

SCOTTISH UNIVERSITIES.

The Prince of Wales' visit to Glasgow to inaugurate the university extension buildings once more appropriately emphasizes the important part which Scottish universities are taking in the development of the national life. This is the second enlargement which Glasgow has been compelled to make within half a century. The university, too, has behind it quite a venerable air of antiquity, as well as the hallmark of modern utility. Its foundation dates back four centuries and a half, and like all the Scottish universities except Edinburgh, which is a post-reformation royal foundation, it owes its existence to ancient ecclesiastical authority. In point of age, however, Glasgow holds only second place in Scotland's honorable academic record. St. Andrew's ranking as doyen, with a margin in its favor of about 50 years, Aberdeen following as a good third. Edinburgh came into being about a century later. But the oldest of the Scottish universities is two centuries younger than Cambridge. As for Oxford, her academic beginnings are quite lost in the haze of Anglo-Saxon antiquity. The town was known as a seat of learning in the year 822.—London Globe.

WALK WILL BE LAID OUT FROM THE LINE

Ridout Street Residents Successful in Application to Board of Works.

No. 2 committee of the city council met last night and transacted routine business. A deputation from Ridout street residents composed of Dr. Nelles and Mr. J. L. Murray was present and protested against the proposed laying of the sidewalk on Ridout street between Elmwood avenue and Bruce street against the fence, carried at the last meeting of the council. It was decided to lay the walk in line with the other walks on the street.

Mr. J. F. Madden, asked that the committee grade the roadway on Thornton avenue from Grosvenor to St. James street. The work will be done provided there are funds enough, as it is realized that it is necessary. Ald. Saunders made the motion to have the work done.

New Walks.
Ald. Gerry presented a complaint from the residents of Bruce street that the quality of cement being used in the sidewalks on that street was very inferior. He protested against the work proceeding until this matter was settled. The complaint will be investigated by City Engineer Graydon.

Cement walks will be laid on the west side of Colborne street between Hill and Simcoe streets and on Garfield avenue to West avenue. A petition sufficiently signed for a tile sewer on Marley Place from Duchess avenue to Tecumseh avenue was presented and will take the usual course.

Asphalt Pavement.
On the city engineer's recommendation a sheet asphalt pavement will be initiated on Adelaide street between Dundas and King streets. City Engineer Graydon recommended that the city charge \$1.50 per hour for 100 feet of hose to citizens who wish to use it to flush sewers. An extra charge of 25 cents an hour to be levied for every 100 feet of fraction over the above amount, and 25 cents an hour for the man's time who accompanies the hose. This recommendation was adopted.

Drinking Fountains.
The request from the Dundas Street Epworth League for the establishing of drinking fountains in the city was referred to the city engineer to obtain figures as to cost and the most suitable place to erect such fountains. Ald. Matthews and City Engineer Graydon will confer with the city solicitor regarding the advisability of framing a bylaw compelling the street railway to stop its cars at certain corners.

The council will hold a special meeting Saturday morning to straighten out the tangle re the Anthistole contract.
