Price Current says: With few exceptions the winter wheat is regarded as maintaining a fairly promising outlook to some extent. Some reports indicate that no judgment could be offered at this time, as its condition and the advent of spring must be awaited to determine the prospect. While reports of this nature leave the situation in doubt as to the localities thus reporting, there is to be noted an absence of discouraging comment, while the expressions of belief, that under favorable weather from now on the plant may be expected to make good progress are more frequent. In the west, scattering reports of Hessian fly working in the fields have been made, but there appears to have been little damage from this cause as yet, even in the localities reporting the presence of the insect. 


